1 **Division A -- Affordable, Quality**
2 **Representation Choices**

3 **Sec. 100. Purpose**

4 (a) Purpose. –

5 (1) In General – The purpose of this division is to

6 provide access to affordable, quality representation for all Americans and
7 reduce growth in government and government spending and other purposes.

8 (b) At no time should any part of Division A be interpreted to
9 support the subjugation of the House of Representatives and/or the Senate
10 for purposes of prosperity and defending against the erosion of liberty.

11 (c) At no time should any part of Division A be considered
12 politically hostile to any political party or individual member of any political
13 party, encumbering.

14 **Title I -- Standards for Qualified** 15 **Representation**

16 **Sec. 101. Requirements for Reforming Representation**

17 (a) In General. – A qualified representative attempting to provide
18 quality representation will demonstrate ample bipartisanship, honor,
19 integrity, love of god, family, and country, and commitment to the
20 Constitution of the United States of America.

21 (b) Requirements Described – prior to the first day of period
22 starting on first day, of period described hear in, as period starting on first day
23 after Election Day 2010, hear on referred to as day one. --

24 (1) Strive for proficiency in reading, writing and
25 comprehension of bills.

26 (i) Grace Period – Recognizing the vast
27 array of congressional backgrounds, from comedians to special interest
28 advocates, a grace period may be determined by the American people, for an
29 otherwise qualified representative, to become proficient in the art of deceptive
30 language, so as to know what to look for in discerning bipartisanship.

31 (2) Defend the Constitution of the United States of
32 America.

33 (3) Serve the people with honesty and Integrity.

34 (4) Avoid “misspeaks”.

35 (5) Pledge to reduce government and spending.

36 (6) Special provisions will be provided for candidates
37 campaigning for office in Chicago, who because of political origin will be
38 enthusiastically forestalled in the national arena.

39 **Title II -- Incumbent Exchange and** 40 **Related Provisions**

41 **Sec 201. Establishment of Representative Exchange**

42 (a) Establishment. – There is established within the next election, a
43 robust representative exchange program, under the direction of legal
44 residents of the United States of America.

45 (b) Provisions Provided for End of Career Care and other purposes.

46 (1) Near end of career counseling should be provided
47 for Representatives, and affordable representation provided for all Americans.

48 (2) Provisions for counseling in areas of embarkment
49 and foresight, provided for representatives, to assure historic continuity.

50 (3) Representatives will be counseled on
51 deprivation of stimulus and campaign funding, depopularization, and the use
52 of pain medication.

53 **Title III -- Shared Responsibility and** 54 **Cooperation**

55 **Sec. 301. Ensuring Adequacy of Provider Networks**

56 (a) Public Option. – A public option will be provided to
57 representatives interested in the Continued Association Program (CAP),

58 (b) or have the opportunity to enroll in the Transitional
59 Representative Association Departure Enactment (TRADE).

60 **Title IV -- Spending and Taxation** 61 **Standards**

62 **Sec. 401. Understanding Benefits Presented by Resolution.**

63 (a) Study. – Citizens, in coordination with qualified representation,
64 shall continue to study the parity in abilities to write and understand Bills

65 presented, and to gain a better understanding of:

66 (1) unelected staff members in coordination with
special interest, non governmental agencies suspected of writing bills.

67 (2) elected members vote on colossal spending bills that
they are denied time to read or have the ability to understand.

68 **Sec. 402. Protection of Incumbent's Choice**

69 (a) Purpose. – The purpose of this section is to provide protection
70 of an Incumbent's choice for purposes of this section. The Incumbent shall be
71 granted all appropriate rights and privileges of becoming a congressional term
72 limit supportive member.

73 **Title V -- Provisions Related to Reelection and**
74 **Funding**

75 **Sec. 501. Prohibiting Pre-Existing Condition Exclusions.**

76 (a) In General -- A qualified candidate/incumbent may not impose
any preexisting condition exclusions or otherwise impose any limit or
conditions, to honor and integrity, based on status quo, under the plan, with
respect to allegiance to the people and to the republic.

Sec. 502. Guaranteed Campaign Funding Renewal

77 (a) Purpose.—The purpose of this section is to establish standards
78 to ensure that new representation and/or incumbent, will benefit from
79 support that is offered in citizen-based contributions.

80 (b) Donations and the Qualified Representative.

81 (1) Supportive contributions may be made to qualified
82 Representatives who provide consistency on issues and opinions. “Flip
83 Flopping” and “misspeaks” will be considered noncompliant with
84 standards described in (sec. 101), and guaranteed campaign funding
85 scaled accordingly.

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
