## A continuation of trivia about the United States Constitution

### **Q. Who actually wrote the Constitution?**

A. In none of the relatively meager records of the Constitutional Convention is the literary authorship of any part of the Constitution definitely established. The deputies debated proposed plans until, on July 24, 1787, substantial agreement having been reached, a Committee of Detail was appointed, consisting of John Rutledge, of South Carolina; Edmund Randolph, of Virginia; Nathaniel Gorham, of Massachusetts; Oliver Ellsworth, of Connecticut; and James Wilson, of Pennsylvania, who on August 6 reported a draft which included a Preamble and twenty-three articles, embodying fifty-seven sections. Debate continued until September 8, when a new Committee of Style was named to revise the draft. This committee included William Samuel Johnson, of Connecticut; Alexander Hamilton, of New York; Gouverneur Morris, of Pennsylvania; James Madison, of Virginia; and Rufus King, of Massachusetts, and they reported the draft in approximately its final shape on September 12. The actual literary form is believed to be largely that of Morris, and the chief testimony for this is in the letters and papers of Madison, and Morris's claim. However, the document in reality was built slowly and laboriously, with not a piece of material included until it has been shaped and approved. The preamble was written by the Committee of Style.

**Some Current Pending Legislation in Ohio**

**H. J. R. No. 2** A Joint Resolution proposing to enact Section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to preserve the freedom of Ohioans to choose their health care and health care coverage. Sponsors: Representatives Maag and Sears

**S. J. R. No. 1** A Joint Resolution proposing to enact Section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to preserve the freedom of Ohioans to choose their health care and health care coverage. Sponsor: Senator Grendell

*The above Resolutions must be passed by 3/5 majority in each house.. It will then go to ballot in November. The language is almost identical to that of the Health Care Freedom Amendment initiative., at this time.*

**H. B. 85** A bill to enact section 3901.711 of the Revised Code to prohibit requiring an individual to obtain or maintain health insurance. Sponsor: Reps Hackett and Sears *Is essentially the same thing as HJR 2.*

**H. B. No. 11** A bill to enact section 3901.711 of the Revised Code to prohibit state departments and agencies from implementing or enforcing a provision of the federal Patient Protection and AffordableCare Act without meeting certain conditions. Sponsors: Reps. Maag and Sears *Unlike the above Joint Resolutions in that it pertains to just one provision of health care law*

**H. B. 125** To amend sections 2305.11, 2307.52, and 2919.16, to enact new sections 2919.17 and 2919.18, and to repeal sections 2919.17 and 2919.18 of the Revised Code to revise the criminal laws governing post-viability abortions. Sponsor: Rep. Wachtmann *Informally called "Heartbeat Bill", it will ensure that all Ohio babies with beating hearts are protected by law.*

**H. B. 63** To amend section 2919.121 of the Revised Code to revise the procedures governing a hearing by which a court may permit a pregnant minor to consent to an abortion or by which a court may give judicial consent for a pregnant minor to have an abortion and to require a court to make its findings with respect to such a hearing by clear and convincing evidence. Sponsor: Rep. Young
