

# Finding the Tarot Reader who is right for you

## Where can I find a Tarot Reader?

In many towns, you don't have to look farther than your city's yellow pages to find a list of Tarot Readers in your area. If you are nervous about going alone to a Tarot Reader's shop bring a friend or ask them to meet you at a quiet restaurant. Phone each reader first. A good reader will be willing to listen if you tell them you are nervous.

If the idea of making a personal visit is too much for you, then you still have many choices. Some of the best Tarot Readers work over the phone, by email or instant message.

## How do I know they are honest?

Every Tarot Reader has the opportunity to join one or more of several professional organizations. Each of these organizations has their own Code of Ethics. Many Tarot Readers have a personal Code of Ethics as well. Ask the Tarot Reader who you are

considering what organizations they belong to and if they have a copy of their Code of Ethics for you to read.

Membership in one of these organizations does not guarantee a great reading, but it does show a willingness to be accountable to others.

You can also ask for references. A Tarot Reading is a very personal service so requesting references is just as important as it would be if you were seeking another professional.

## How do I handle the money?

A Professional Tarot Reader should have a clearly defined pricing structure. There should be no hidden fees. You should know the total cost before the reading begins.

## What else do I need to know?

If you are having a phone or live reader, many readers will offer you an opportunity to tape your reading. This can be helpful, as a reading can sometimes be a lot to process in a short period of time.

## What do I do if things go wrong?

The first thing to do if things go wrong with a reading is to calmly talk to the Tarot Reader. Share what about the experience was unsatisfactory and see what if any thing the Tarot Reader is willing to do to help you.

If the two of you cannot reach an agreement, then look for a mediator. If the Tarot Reader is a member of a professional organization, they will be able to help you.

The most important thing to remember is, never spend more for a reading than you can afford especially if this is your first experience with a Tarot Reader.
