A Charismatic and Engaging Candidate

Obama electrifies a crowd wherever he goes and will draw new people to the voting booth. Presidential contests are, in large part, referendums on the perceived character of the candidates. Many voters, including a large percentage of so-called "swing voters," rely on visceral or emotional criteria every bit as much as intellectual criteria (which Obama already has plenty of). And it's not just about getting elected. The more talented and charismatic a president is, the better his or her chances are of actually accomplishing something meaningful in office.

Sound Judgment on Iraq

In late 2002, in the lead up to the invasion of Iraq, it seemed like everyone went collectively nuts. The press, including most liberal pundits, was accepting everything the administration was saying at face value. They were failing to ask obvious questions and vilifying those who did. Amidst this hysteria, Obama, got up in front of a crowd in Chicago and said:

"Now let me be clear: I suffer no illusions about Saddam Hussein. He is a brutal man. A ruthless man. A man who butchers his own people to secure his own power. The world, and the Iraqi people, would be better off without him. But I also know that Saddam poses no imminent and direct threat to the United States, or to his neighbors and that in concert with the international community he can be contained until, in the way of all petty dictators, he falls away into the dustbin of history.

I know that even a successful war against Iraq will require a U.S. occupation of undetermined length, at undetermined cost, with undetermined consequences. I know that an invasion of Iraq without a clear rationale and without strong international support will only fan the flames of the Middle East, and encourage the worst, rather than best, impulses of the Arab world, and strengthen the recruitment arm of al-Qaeda."

What he said then was not only incredibly astute, it was politically courageous. It's easy to forget how few politicians were willing to say anything like this in public back then.

A Small Portion of the Case for Gore

Frequently Asked Questions

Why Gore-Obama 2008?

Can you think of a stronger Democratic ticket for 2008 that can also bring in Independent and moderate Republican voters? Seriously, can you? Several of the possible candidate combinations are good, but Gore-Obama is great. Good combinations can lose elections, great combinations do not.

Gore has avoided a “Sherman Statement” but has not announced his candidacy. Will Al Gore actually run in 2008?

We believe that he can be convinced to. Remember that for the 2000 election he did not announce until mid-June 1999. More importantly, Gore does not face the same fundraising pressures that the announced candidates do in order to establish name recognition and get their message out. Gore’s current environmental activities give him a continuous high profile in the media without the need for fundraising.

What does Gore have that the announced candidates lack?

Above and beyond his experience in Congress, Gore has eight years experience in the White House – no other Democrat can touch this. He has the proven ability to get over 50 million votes for president - Democrats should not take the 2008 election for granted.

Gore has broad international respect from foreign leaders and their constituents. This is a critical factor in creating productive working relationships to address serious international issues where leaders do not want to alienate their own electorates.

Obama said “You don’t run for Vice President”. How does that change your efforts for a Gore-Obama ticket in 2008?

It doesn’t hurt Gore-Obama 2008 efforts at all. In fact, it actually helps us. Moreover, we would be disappointed if Senator Obama stated he wanted to run for Vice President. The Vice President should capably demonstrate they can assume the role of President and the best way to do so is by running for President. As Senator Obama continues to strengthen the case for his presidency, he simultaneously strengthens his position as the best Vice Presidential choice for Gore.

What do Al Gore and Barack Obama have that the other potential candidate combinations do not?

There are many factors. Both are highly respected, not only within the Democratic Party, but by Independent and moderate Republican swing voters – a critical factor for victory in 2008. In addition only Gore and Obama have generated large new waves of energized and politically aware American voters. They are the only two who individually meet the multi-point criteria (page 2)

How are you different from “Draft Gore” movements?

Obviously, we are inextricably linked to “Draft Gore” movements. But we also believe the best way for the Democrats to take back the White House in 2008 is to run with the strongest possible team. As Americans we vote for two leaders and should have a say in the selection of both.

Assuming Gore was the Democratic candidate in 2008, would he offer Senator Obama the Vice Presidential slot?

Yes, we believe that he would because of the widespread support for Senator Obama. American is a democracy and we elect our leaders. There is no reason whatsoever that we should not have a voice in both the Presidential and Vice Presidential selection. A presidential candidate may be great but a bad choice for a running mate can harm a race.

Vote by vote, precinct by precinct, door by door, election by election, we will take this country back for the people who built it.
