

It's Your Choice: Keep the Income Tax in Massachusetts — or END it?

On November 4th, 2008 voters in Massachusetts will have a choice on the ballot: whether to keep or END the State Income Tax.

Here are the undeniable facts every Massachusetts voter should know about the Ballot Initiative to END the Income Tax:

If you vote "yes", you are voting to END the state income tax and give back \$3,700 each to over 3,400,000 Massachusetts workers - including you. \$3,700 average. Each worker. Not just once. \$3,700 every year. Tax free! Your "yes" vote will roll back state government funding and spending \$12 Billion -- to the 1999 budget level. \$35 Billion a year.

If you vote "no", you are voting to KEEP the state income tax and require 3,400,000 Massachusetts workers - including you - to each pay \$3,700 in state income taxes. \$3,700 average. Each worker. Not just once. It will cost you \$3,700 in state income taxes every year.

Your "no" vote will keep this year's state government spending at \$47 Billion. Which choice is best for you, your family, your neighbors, and your co-workers? Which choice makes them better off? Which choice makes them worse off?

Both choices spend \$47 billion in Massachusetts.

Voting "yes" means that the Massachusetts state government decides how and where to spend \$34.7 billion. And 3,400,000 workers and taxpayers each decide how and where to spend their \$3,700 share of the other \$12 billion.

Voting "yes" will create hundreds of thousands of new jobs in Massachusetts

Voting "no" means that the Massachusetts state government decides how and where to spend the whole \$47.3 billion.

Which choice is best for the 3,400,000 workers and taxpayers of Massachusetts?

"Eliminating the state income tax would reduce government spending by about \$11 billion, shrinking the budget to its 1995 level. But that \$11 billion would not be lost. It would be back in the private sector - back in the hands of the men and women who earned it, and who are far more likely to spend, invest, or donate it wisely than the bloated state bureaucracy it goes to now".
