Election Procedures for December 8, 2008

Nominations must be made by a voting member, followed by a second by a voting member.

Election of new chairman will be first.

If there is more than one person running for chairman, then by lot, the order of nominating and seconding speeches will be heard. (7 minute time limit per candidate)

The secret paper ballot will be filled out and collected. Each candidate will have a teller present to supervise the counting of the ballots. The Head Teller will be our legal counsel Brian Battaglia.

The voting results will be announced.

If three or more persons are in a race and there is no majority (50% + 1), then the top two will have a run-off election.

In all other races, (Vice-Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer) nominating/seconding speeches will be heard. (5 minute time limit per candidate).

If a person is nominated and seconded without opposition then the winner will be allowed to give a speech.

The ballots will be destroyed after each election per party rules.

The current chairman conducts the election of the chairman and vice-chairman. The new chairman conducts the election of the new secretary and treasurer.

Nominations can come from the floor.
