Your request for the event/activity outlined on the original application form has been approved with these additional stipulations, and understandings:

1. In accordance with City Ordinance, Section 3.50.070, a **\$5.00** petition processing fee has/has not been received.
2. This **permit refers to City property** within the jurisdictional property boundaries of Salt Lake City. Permission for Salt Lake County, the State of Utah, Federal Government, etc. will require that you obtain permission from those respective governments.
3. **You must not interfere with pedestrian traffic**, if you will be setting up tables on the sidewalks or curt area, from which to pass out literature or pamphlets. This permit does NOT authorize permission for the use of privately owned property.
4. **You must position your activity and participants** in such a way that **pedestrians have safe passage and access to the sidewalks and building entrances**. You may not block or attempt to block any entrance or driveway.

5. Please keep in mind that if there are other requests for picketing between now and your requested date, you will each be assigned a different area of sidewalk on which to picket, thus eliminating any conflict with your individual activities.
6. You **must not force or attempt to force** anyone to listen to you or to take your literature.
7. You **may NOT tie, nail, or otherwise attach** any banners, signs, pictures, instructional materials, symbols, or other personal property to any City property, in a permanent or temporary manner.
8. If **signs or banners** are used, see below in the Petition Guidelines regarding such use. Signs and banners must not obstruct the view of pedestrian or vehicular traffic, or pose safety issues. You may not litter.
9. If you are giving away merchandise and asking for “**donations**,” remember that you must give away the merchandise, even if the recipient declines to make a donation. If merchandise is sold, you may be violating City business licensing laws. Check with the City business licensing department for information on selling goods and merchandise.
10. **Because your demonstration takes place on the sidewalks, you must obey all regulations and laws** relating to vehicular and pedestrian traffic. You must cross at the proper locations, using sidewalks, cross walks, light signals/semaphores, and exercise all safety precautions.
11. **Do not initiate adverse safety conditions** by attempting to handout literature to vehicles in traffic lanes, or passengers in stationary or moving vehicles. All regulations pertaining to vehicular traffic must be obeyed.
12. **A free expression activity permit does not allow the participants to violate the noise ordinance or regulations of either Salt Lake City or Salt Lake County.** You must conduct your event within the confines of the noise ordinances of both governments.
13. **City Ordinance, Section 5.68.050** prevents you from operating a sound device without obtaining a permit with the City License office at least **(10) days prior** to the date of your demonstration. Please note that noise is governed by Health Regulation #21 Noise Control, of the Salt Lake Valley Health Department, adopted as law by Salt Lake City Ordinance 9.02.010 SLC Code. “Please also be aware of the following sections of the SLC Code regulating noise and sound: Chapter 5.68; Chapter 9.28; Chapter 12.89; and Section 11.12.020.” Specifically Regulation 21.9 specifies noise levels. **A permit issued by the Salt Lake Valley Health department is required if the noise will exceed specified decibel limits.** The regulation pertains to noise measured at the boundary line of any “affected property.”
14. **In accordance with City Code Chapter 15.30 smoking is prohibited in City Parks, recreational areas, cemeteries and neat mass gatherings.**
15. You must contact the **Salt Lake Valley Health Department Bureau of Food Protection** at 788 Woodoak Lane (5380 So.) Salt Lake City, or call them at 313-6620 in order to obtain a **Temporary Food Permit** for your activity. You are responsible for any fees that may be required.
16. **You will be responsible for cleaning the trash, debris, and litter generated during your activity.**

17. Attached to this permit are the **Salt Lake City First Amendment Petition Guidelines**, by which you and the participants in your group should govern yourselves. Please conduct yourselves accordingly.

First Amendment Petition Guidelines Salt Lake City Corporation

1. Any signs must be carried by hand or supported by lathe-type sticks only.
2. You may not interfere with pedestrians or vehicular traffic. If people do not stop to listen to you, you may not insist that they do so. *Specifically, you may not grab or attempt to physically restrain or touch visitors of the businesses or residences in the area or any person on public or private property.*
3. You may *not block or attempt to block any entrance or driveways.*
4. The petitioner has agreed that the group leader will be the group coordinator.
5. The petitioner shall use its best efforts to notify all participants of these rules *prior* to the start of the event.
6. The petitioner acknowledges that *the event is for nonviolent purposes.*
7. The petitioner agrees to be responsible to leave the areas of the event clean, and that all objects such as: signs, sticks, leaflets, or candles will be removed by the petitioner's group.
8. The petitioner acknowledges the constitutional right of anyone to ignore or not listen to your group and ignore or not read any information literature that your group may be passing out.
9. Your group may not obstruct the free passage of pedestrians, vehicles, block driveways, entrances, or exits to any business or building, and may not enter onto private property without the permission of the property owner.
10. The group shall abide by all pertinent local, state, and federal ordinances and laws while conducting the activity.
11. Violent acts will NOT be tolerated in any manner.
