is essentially to this: The hope for the foreseeable future lies, not in building up a few ambitious central institutions of universal membership and general jurisdiction as was envisaged at the end of the last war, but rather in the much more decentralized, orderly and pragmatic process of inventing or adapting institutions of limited jurisdiction and selected membership to deal with specific problems on a case-by-case basis, as the necessity for international cooperation is perceived by the relevant nations. Such institutions of limited jurisdiction will have a better chance of doing what must be done to make a "rule of law" possible among nations—providing methods for changing the law and enforcing it as it changes and developing the perception of common interests that is the prerequisite for successful cooperation.

In short, the "house of world order" will have to be built from the bottom up rather than from the top down. It will look like a great "booming, buzzing confusion," to use William James' famous description of reality, but an end run around national sovereignty, eroding it piece by piece, will accomplish much more than the old-fashioned frontal assault. Of course, for political as well as administrative reasons, some of these specialized

Compare this 10-Point Plan for “World Order” with Today’s Headlines

1. Reform the IMF for greater control of international currency and to replace the dollar standard
2. Rewrite the ground rules for international trade (GATT, WTO...)
3. Increase multilateral development and technical aid (World Bank)
4. Global and regional agencies to protect the world’s environment; international agencies given broader powers to promulgate and revise pollution standards
5. World action on population problem under guise of basic human rights
6. Assure sufficient food supplies worldwide (World Food Conference)
7. Law of the Sea Conference leading to “a new international regime governing *the world’s oceans*” (emphasis theirs)
8. Regulate emerging communication technologies
9. Multilateral negotiations to limit conventional weapons, with UN and regional bodies to administer, verify and enforce the agreements
10. Increasing resort to UN forces to contain local conflicts

Warnings and Cautions from George Washington's Farewell Address

- 39 Why forego the advantages of so peculiar a situation? Why quit our own to stand upon foreign ground? **Why, by interweaving our destiny with that of any part of Europe, entangle our peace and prosperity in the toils of European ambition, rivalship, interest, humor, or caprice?**
- 40 **It is our true policy to steer clear of permanent alliances with any portion of the foreign world;** so far, I mean, as we are now at liberty to do it; for let me not be understood as capable of patronizing infidelity to existing engagements. I hold the maxim no less applicable to public than to private affairs, that honesty is always the best policy. I repeat it, therefore, let those engagements be observed in their genuine sense. But, in my opinion, it is unnecessary and would be unwise to extend them.
- 41 Taking care always to keep ourselves, by suitable establishments, on a respectable defensive posture, **we may safely trust to temporary alliances for extraordinary emergencies.**
