San Gemini Preservation Studies is a series of courses, field projects and tours aimed at fostering the preservation of cultural heritage. The program offers students both theoretical knowledge in the classroom and hands-on skills on field projects. The program also includes field trips in central Italy to places of general cultural and historical interest along with visits to sites currently undergoing professional restoration.

The program is interdisciplinary, open to any students interested in conservation and the preservation of cultural heritage.

- Historic Buildings Surveying (3 credits)
- Introduction to Art and Architectural Restoration (3 credits)
- Materials and Methods in Traditional Italian Painting (3 credits)
- Theory of Restoration (3 credits)
- History of Italian Gardens and Urban Landscape (3 credits)

#### Ongoing Field Projects:

- The survey and restoration of the Church of San Giovanni Battista in San Gemini (12th-century)
- Survey of the Church of Santo Gemine (14th-century)
- The archaeological survey and conservation of the Roman public baths in nearby ancient Carsulae
